1.0 PURPOSE

Establishing and maintaining Project safety is paramount for the Entities to achieve their goal of effectively and efficiently managing safety on Construction Projects across the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA).

EXPRO has produced five Chapters that have been developed using International best practices. This will enable the Entities to attain high standard of Safety in their delivery of a successful Project.

The five Chapters in order are as follows:

- · General requirements
- Safety requirements
- Health requirements
- Environmental requirements
- Site Security requirements

Detailed procedures including guidelines and templates are contained within each of the above Chapters that are contained in Volume 11 of the KSA Project White Book.

2.0 CONTENT

2.1 General Requirements (Chapter 2)

The purpose of the procedures/plans/templates in Chapter 2 is to establish the direction, responsibilities and process to develop, execute and maintain a successful Project Safety Management System (SMS).

The Chapter contains information and guidance to all KSA Entities for an effective implementation of standards to Project planning.

2.2 Safety Requirements (Chapter 3)

Procedures contained in this Chapter is information derived from international standards, international best practices and guidelines. They are designed to give guidance and information to Supervisors to assist in the planning of various tasks.

The information provided must be made available to all personnel that must conduct tasks. It is also there to help the individuals plan their work, and knowing what the minimal requirements are.

2.3 Health Requirements (Chapter 4)

The purpose of this chapter is to assist Management in ensuring that there is sufficient processes in place to ensure that all personnel under their control are not in a position that exposes them to a risk that could have an adverse effect to their health.

It focusses on Medical Services requirements, maintaining health records, sampling of data (includes dust, noise) personal protective equipment, respirator fit testing.

2.4 Environmental Requirements (Chapter 5)

The procedures contained in this chapter explains how ensure that Project's maintain a high standard of environmental control.

The Chapter covers Pollution, Asbestos, Waste, and Compliance Evaluation.
